Hello from Sundance !

We are getting in touch with people from Bishop's Castle who are environmentally aware, to let you know about what we do, because we'd like you to join us to make a real impact on Wales' carbon footprint. If you do, you'll find we can help cut your costs, and reduce your environmental impact significantly too.

Who are Sundance?

Since 2004, Sundance Renewables has been producing quality fuel at the first community based biodiesel production plant in the UK. This not for profit workers co-operative and award-winning social enterprise has pioneered local production of biodiesel from recycled vegetable oil, and collects used vegetable oil from a wide variety of local outlets, converting it into a low-emissions alternative to diesel.

Why Biodiesel?

When used in standard diesel engines, biodiesel emissions are much cleaner than conventional diesel with significant reductions for pollutants such as carbon monoxide, particulates, sulphates and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, reducing the associated health risks.

Also, it's a great way to shrink your carbon footprint...Did you know that biodiesel emits less than 40g/km of CO₂ - which is significantly less than the average figures for new cars of around 120g/km. And using recycled oil to make it means it's practically carbon neutral! If you replace 2500 litres of fuel a year with Sundance Community Fuel, you will save over 6000 kg CO₂ emissions. Together we have the potential to significantly reduce Wales's carbon footprint.

How does this work?

Sundance sells to its members, Friends of Sundance, who come to our Capel Hendre site near Ammanford or receive deliveries of fuel across Wales, where we also arrange used oil collections. This contributes to community recycling and retains wealth in the local economy. We have a delivery run to Montgomery every other month, and this would be an ideal opportunity to deliver to Bishop's Castle. We are also supporting the provision of biodiesel clubs in several locations, which is a good way to ensure a regular local supply.

Our vision is to grow the provision of biodiesel made from recycled vegetable oil in Wales, with commitment to community and support for local initiatives. With support from the Good Fuel Co-op (www.goodfuel.coop) we've recently expanded our production by taking on the regeneration of a second biodiesel plant in Tredegar, which means we have more fuel to sell, and can reduce the carbon footprint of our transport by so much more. We hope you'll decide to join us to help make this happen.

What does it cost?

Sundance community fuel is 96.6 pence per litre in containers, so it won't cost the earth.

We can deliver it free of charge in 25 litre containers, which we supply at £3 each (refundable).

If you need a larger amount, you can have it in a 1000 litre IBC which we can supply for £50.

For 1000 litres we can offer a reduced price of 89p/litre ex VAT- a total price of £934.50 including VAT.

We can also offer a sales agreement for the purchase of 2500 litres at a guaranteed price of 87.5p/litre ex VAT.

Terms for this are payment for 1000 litres in advance with the rest on delivery according to your requirements.

It's quite a saving on the price of diesel at the pump, and can be easily blended with diesel in any proportion - and any amount used will reduce your carbon footprint.
